Content Guidelines

Synopsis:

*Jitney* is a part of August Wilson's decade depiction plays taking place in 1977. The play takes place in the Hill District of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, where gypsy taxi companies- known as "jitneys"- used to serve as transportation alternatives for their communities. Wilson portrays the struggles and triumphs of the work-class through five African American men struggling through their day-to-day

Language:

Profanity and racial identity language that might be deemed "inappropriate" by audience members are a part of these characters' natural language towards one another, and used occasionally throughout the play. Specific words include variations of "f\*ck", "sh\*t", "d\*mn", "b\*tch", "n\*\*\*er".

Smoking/Drinking:

There are occasional references and portrayals of alcohol use on stage.

Sex:

There are vague references made to sex in this play.

Violence:

Violence is referenced, and there is one scene involving the use of a gun during the performance. Additionally, there are a couple of instances of physical violence portrayed.

Rated PG-13 for adult language and adult situations
