



#### **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

This play was originally slated to be part of the 2020 season here at The Rep and would have marked my directorial debut. Then the pandemic came along. They say if you want to hear God laugh, make a plan. I'm grateful this play has finally made its way to the stage—six years after it was first planned.

#### James Baldwin said of writing the play:

"I was armed, I knew, in attempting to write the play, by the fact that I was born in the church. I knew that out of the ritual of the church, historically speaking, comes the act of the theatre... I knew that what I wanted to do in the theatre was to recreate moments I remembered as a boy preacher, to involve the people, even against their will, to shake them up, and, hopefully, to change them."

Doing this play—at home, at the theatre where I first fell in love with the stage, in the city that raised me, and featuring some of the churches and people who raised me—is truly a gift.

I hope you enjoy the show, and I hope you'll come back to see us next year as well.


